### Report on Micro Teaching Practise Sessions

As per the guidelines for B.Ed. Programme given by TNTEU, conceptual orientation about micro teaching was provided to the student teachers to obtain an understanding and to enhance their teaching competency before they go for real teaching in their internship schools. Micro teaching orientation and practice sessions were organized from 18/7/2022 to 25/7/2022 for the students admitted in the academic year 2022 - 2024. The teacher explained the need for having micro teaching and in addition gave a description about the steps and procedures to be followed during the practice of micro teaching. Each teacher gave clarification on the assigned skill (Skill of Introduction, Explaining, Probing Questions, Skill of Stimulus Variation, Non-verbal cues, Reinforcement, Closure, Usage of Blackboard & Link lesson). This direction lined the way for the students to get a clear idea on each skill considered necessary for micro teaching. The students started writing lesson plans with respect to each skill in terms of practicing all the skills required. They practiced teaching in groups after getting the lesson plans corrected from the pedagogy teachers. In the course of this practice session, each student got a chance to practice the skills and so all the student teachers got benefitted towards the enhancement of their teaching.

### Report on Assessment of Learning

Our college organized a session on 22/11/2022 titled "Introduction to Assessment of Learning". The resource person for the session is Mrs. Rajeswari. The Core areas focused by the resource person includes testing, evaluation, difference between testing and evaluation, diagnostic test and its purpose, achievement test and its purpose, aptitude and proficiency test, assessment for learning, assessment of learning and assessment as learning. The facilitator covered few more concepts like kinds of written type examinations which includes oral type questions, short answer and essay type questions. She differentiated each of these types with examples. She also covered the steps in planning and construction of an achievement test, characteristics of a good test, analysis of test items using item difficulty and discrimination index through example. A model question paper along with blueprint and mark scheme is shown as an example.

#### 1. Onam




#### Pongal

As the Pongal festival is marked with colourfulkolams or decorative artwork, the student teachers drew kolams by using rice flour along with natural or synthetic color powders.




