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

Independence Day 15/08/2022

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Anti-Ragging Day: Poster Making Competition conducted on 26/08/2022





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
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Onam Celebration - 06/09/2022

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
Gandhi Jayanthi Programme - Tamil Essay Writing Competition on 29/09/2022

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


Diwali Celebration – Food festival conducted by Health club on 15/11/2022

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
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Legal Awareness Programme held on 24/11/2022

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Field Trip to Trivandrum 19/08//2022











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Field Trip to Trivandrum 01/12/2022

The students of B. Ed history along with the lecturer started their journey from the campus at 7.00 a.m on 01/12/2022.




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

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Christmas Celebrations held on 22/12/2022





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Pongal Celebrations held on 12/01/2023



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

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
Workshop on Vegetable Carving and Flower arrangement held on 09/02/2023

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
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உலகதாய்மொழிதினம்

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ELECTORAL LITERACY – 28/03/2023



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
NAPKIN AWARENESS PROGRAMME


