

VISIT TO PRIYADARSHINI PLANETARIUM, TRIVANDRUM BY PHYSICAL SCIENCE STUDENTS



Besides that, visitors we can view galleries on Popular Science, Mathematics, Automobile, Biomedical Engineering, Computer and Solar Energy, a Science Park, a Mobile Science Exhibition Unit.

Muslim College of Education organized a one-day field trip to Priyadarshini Planetarium, Trivandrum for physical science students on 23/02/2019.
