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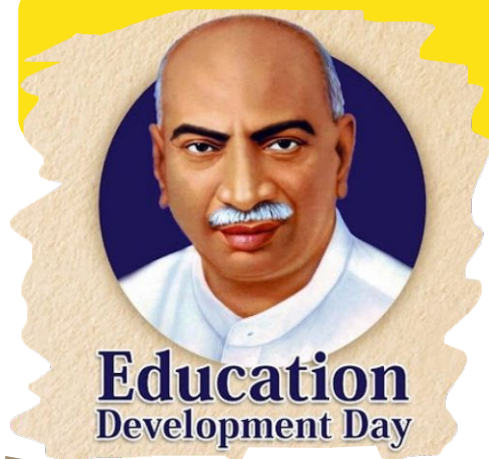
KAMARAJAR'S BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION

Exhibition - "Pollution as a Global Challenge"

Our environment faces several problems and many of these seem to be worsening with time, bringing us into a time of a true environmental crisis. Therefore enhancing public awareness of these problems is essential to lessen their detrimental effects. Environmental pollution is increasing day by day and imposing severe and irreversible damage to the world. It is of different types: air, water, soil, noise, light, etc. Urbanization and technological development have put the survival of the planet in danger by degrading the quality of the environment's essential elements—air, water and soil—due to the release of hazardous waste from factories like plastics, heavy metals, nitrates, burning of fossil fuels, acid rain, oil spills and industrial toxins. Urbanization and overpopulation have increased city noise and light pollution. Polluting agents are exponentially increasing in modern society, disturbing the ecological balance and posing extinction problems for different animal and bird species. This is because the destruction of plants, especially trees, by acid rains disturbs the natural especially trees, by acid rains disturbs the natural environment of animals. Anti-Ragging Day: Poster Making Competition conducted on 25/07/2023

"Ragging is any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written, or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the psyche of a fresher or a junior student."

After the death of a first-year student from Jadavpur University allegedly linked to ragging, University Grant Commission has asked colleges and universities to observe anti-ragging week from August 12 to August 18. The institutions of higher education are directed to implement anti-ragging measures already spelt out in detail by the UGC and also to organize orientation and induction programmes with a view to encourage students to follow anti-ragging steps on the campus.

Under the direction of UGC and Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, Muslim College of Education, Thiruvithancode has conducted a poster making competition on “Anti-Ragging” to educate about the evils of ragging and also to spread positive vibes among the students in the college premises. The competition was held on 25/07/2023 in the seminar hall for students to spread positive ideas among them. The Competition was inaugurated by our respected Secretary, Lion. Dr. H. Mohammed Ali. MICRO TEACHING

SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Muslim College of Education conducted Skill Development Programme for B.Ed. first year student teachers from 21/08/2023 to 26/08/2023 at 10.00 a.m.

The Skill Development Programme was organized as it determines the student teachers to get trained and well-groomed to carry out their duties effectively. It helps them to develop self-confidence, speech modulation and expressive abilities. They learn time management, improve body language, imbibe a positive attitude and improve communication skills, which are very important when taking up teaching as a profession.

Micro teaching is a highly individualized training device and an experiment in the field of teacher education which has been incorporated in the practice of teaching schedule. The students are providing immediate feedback in terms of peer group feedback, tape recorder, or CCTV. Micro teaching is a student teaching skill training technique and not a teaching technique or method. Student teachers are asked to practice one skill at a time. The class size was reduced to 5 to 10 pupils or students. The content was limited to a single concept. Micro teaching is micro in the sense that it scales down the complexities of real teaching. Micro teaching advocates the choice and practice of one skill at a time.
