EYE DONATION AWARENESS PROGRAMME HELD ON 30/10/2019

Blindness is a worldwide problem. Corneal blindness accounts for 0.9% of blindness in India. Approximately 0.12 million people are Corneal blind. Restoration of their vision is possible only through transplantation. Though 45000 eyes are collected every year, it does not meet half the requirement.

Realizing the potential of the situation an Eye Donation Awareness Programme was organized by the Muslim College of Education on 30/10/2019 in the seminar hall from 10.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. The program was inaugurated by Lion. Dr. H. Mohammed Ali, Secretary, Muslim College of Education. Dr. V.S. Pramod welcomed the guests and in his inaugural address, he highlighted the importance of eye donation. The resource person for the programme was Lion. Dr. J. Ganesh M.J.F

Lion Dr. J. Ganesh began the program with a formal greeting. Then he gave a brief introduction about the eye donation. Donating one's eyes after his/her death is Eye donation. Merely Corneal blinds can be helped through this procedure. It is an action to help, mainly for the assistance of the society and is totally charitable. It is done after death. So, the eye-donation should be exalted in a large scale, as one of the best means of communal service. To allow another person to get vision is one of the best procedures of charity. Even after death the donor lives in the eyes of the recipient. Eyes of a dead person can enable two blind people to acquire the vision, said Lion. Dr. J. Ganesh. Then he listed out the reasons why we need to donate our eyes.

A few video clippings were displayed by Lion Dr. J. Ganesh. It describes about the statistics of eye donation. In video clipping a few celebrities described the significance of eye donation. Lion Dr. J. Ganesh asserts that students play a vital role in creating awareness about eye donation. Students can enhance eye donation rates by educating and motivating the relatives for eye donation. They can teach this great thing to the student also. There was an interactive session. Dr. J. Ganesh asked a few questions to the teacher trainees. Those who answered the questions were appreciated and honoured with prizes.

Dr. J. Ganesh explained the structure of the eyes. He explained in detail the internal structure of a-lens, retina, optic nerves, aqueous humor and also the external structure of an eye-sclera, conjunctiva, cornea, iris and pupil. This was useful for everyone. Students were actively heard his words. Finally, he concluded his session after describing the recent development and techniques to cure eye problems. He also explained the long sight and short sight problems faced by small children. Then he says how to cure the long sight and the short sight problems by using specs eye lens and laser treatments. The doubts raised by the students and staff were cleared. After the session, four students gave feedback to the Eye Camp Awareness Program Mrs. JabaNisha, faculty expressed vote of thanks.
