HOW TO REACH THE CAMPUS

Muslim College of Education is located in No1 New Street, Thiruvithancode, Kanyakumari Dist. Tamil Nadu. The College is about 10 km south of Nagercoil and 12 km. north of Marthadam. The nearest railway station is Eraniel, at a distance of 5km. The nearest airport is Trivandrum International Airport at a distance of 57.5 km away from the College. The sprawling campus of 5 acres is quiet and conducive to serious academic pursuit. ABOUT THE CAMPUS

The Muslim College of Education is located at No. 1 New Street, Thiruvithancode, Kanyakumari District, Tamil Nadu. About 10 km south of Nagercoil and 12 km north of Marthadam is where the college is. Eraniel, 5 km away, is the closest train station. The airport closest to the College is Trivandrum International Airport, which is 57.5 km away. The sprawling, 5-acre campus is quiet and good for serious academic work. Beautifully landscaped with tiles and plants for gardening, it is still a great place for the teacher-trainees to think and feel.

It is a dream project of the Muslim Educational Society(MES) Thiruvithancode, a society fashioned to uplift the marginalized sections of the people in Kannivakumari. The Muslim College of Education had its inception in the year 2007 with 100 B.Ed. teacher -trainees. In the year 2008, the College was granted permission to launch the M.Ed. course. Representing the minority, the college has unlocked its doors to all and sundry who cherished to get into this institution for admission. A galaxy of eminent teachers with competency, professionalism, passion, devotion and dedication, with the infinite support furnished by the management, has ignited the institution to grow with a remarkable legacy within a short span of time. Our College was accredited with "B" grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) of the UGC. They were extremely pleased with the academic excellence, organization, staff pattern, physical environment, and outreach programmes of the College. It has provided us added responsivity and commitments to work for improvement. We strongly believe in the NAAC dictum, Quality Enhancement and Quality sustenance. We strive hard to uphold it.

In 2014 the institution got permission to start M.Phil. Course in Education, with 20 full time scholars. Ours is the only College

Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, Chennai. The College is also preparing for opening twinning programmes with institutions of global repute. The Muslim College of Education is proud of the fact that it gives the teacher-trainees maximum opportunities for outreach programmes. We believe greatly in value, support and collaboration, discussion, and dialogue with a variety of local and regional community associates.

The College organize add on programmes like Yoga, Ornamental Decoration, Fruits and Vegetable Carving, Candle Making, Glass Painting, Flower Making and Flower Arrangement and so on. Communicative English is another area which we give maximum concentration on. The College has an association with the Junior Chamber International Trivandrum Chapter. It is an international organization formed to inspire the youth and also to empower them. The training programmes of JCI inspire our young budding teacher -trainees to explore the vast ocean of opportunities in the field of teaching.

The Muslim College of Education has started a peer reviewed biannual national journal titled Teacher Learner and Society (TeLes) in the year 2013 with the ISSN 2348-8409. After the warm recognition received by TeLeS, by the intelligentsia, inspired us to start an international journal titled International Journal of perspectives in Education, (IJPE) with the ISSN 2456-3412 in 2016. It is also a peer reviewed multi-disciplinary international journal.

Realising the feasibility of starting integrated courses the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) granted the Muslim College of Education, permission to start 4 year B.AB.Ed and BScB.Ed integrated courses from the academic year 2017 -2018. Only 8 colleges of education in Tamil Nadu have such a credential status.

IQAC

In response to the recommendations of NPE (1986) about addressing the issues of deterioration in quality of education, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) was set up in 1986. The NAAC Peer Team visits institutions and grades them in accordance with the quality standards maintained therein. Our institution was accredited 2013. Though we bagged the 'B' Grade, there was much to learn from the suggestions provided by the NAAC Peer Team. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was formally composed, and each year the same is recomposed keeping in mind the needs of the institution, the nature of the staff, etc. In order to obtain objective suggestions and remarks, the IQAC panel included the Head of the Institution, a few senior administrative officers, three to eight teachers, one member from the Management, two nominees from local society, Students and Alumni representatives, two nominees from Employers, Industrialists and stakeholders and one as the Co-ordinator of the IQAC. This team consistently makes forays into various institutional activities to enhance and sustain the quality of education provided.

In 2013 the College was accredited with 'B' grade by NAAC. The IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell) was formed in the year 2013 for development and application of quality benchmarks/parameters for the various academic and administrative activities of the College. The primary aim of IQAC are

Assembly and Thought for the Day

Remedial Teaching

The college also provides remedial instruction to students who require additional guidance or instructional aids. The college strives to maintain an academic atmosphere which encourages learning, research and healthy academic competition. Teachers must diagnose and prepare instructional materials for remedial teaching to ensure the desired quality of learning. Remedial teaching is a crucial component of the teaching-learning process.

Health Club

Placement Cell

The aim of B.Ed. course is to produce competent and skilled teachers. A teacher can become capable of contributing to the society. There is a provision for five days SUPW camp. Library

Our college has a full-fledged library and Information Centre with all the modern facilities like Computer aided information retrieval and Reprographic Services, including printer and internet facilities. The Library has a collection of nearly 8000 books and about 500 periodical archives, 200 international dissertations and 255 CDs in the thrust areas of various subjects. The library has about 285 international journals. The Library also provides information and guidance regarding electronic journals and online information retrieval to the interested readers. The Library caters to the needs of 160 regular users in the college which include faculty, M.Phil. & M.Ed. Scholars, B.Ed. Teacher-Trainees and B.Sc. B.Ed. students. It also provides information service to the P.G students, Research scholars and teachers from the neighbouring academic institutions and colleges. The Library is open on weekdays from 9 AM to 5 PM.

Library works and duties

- ★ All teacher trainees are expected to use the library regularly
- ★ Teacher trainees are allowed to borrow only two books at a time and retain them for a period of one week.
- ★ The librarian has the right to call for a book borrowed by any member even before the expiry of normal period of one week.

- ★ If the borrowed books are not returned to the library on the due date, a fine of Rs 1 per day will be charged.

- ★ Teacher-Trainees suffering from contagious or infectious or infectious diseases are not allowed to enter the class. Cases of such illness should be reported to the Principal in advance.
- ★ Every teacher trainee is expected to take an active part in the co-curricular activities like games, sports, literary associations, educational tours, picnics etc arranged by the college.
- ★ No teacher trainee will be excused from General Assembly and Thought for the Day, without valid reasons. Duties of a teacher-trainee
- ★ Teacher-trainees are expected to keep decorum and dignity in expressions on campus.
- ★ Every teacher-trainee shall have with him/her the textbooks and notebooks and other materials required for the classes.
- ★ All assignments shall be regularly completed and as desired by the concerned.
- ★ Indifference towards any subject, discourtesy towards any member of the staff, or any act, which affects the discipline of the College will be viewed seriously.

Leave

- * All applications for leave should be submitted in the prescribed form to the principal a day before it is required, except in case of sudden illness.
- ★ Casual leave may be granted amounting to not more than five days at a time exclusive of Sundays and other holidays.
- ★ The period of absence at any time shall not exceed 10 days in an academic year.

Computer Laboratory

Our institution has opened up the windows on knowledge by setting up a well equippedcomputer laboratory which assists us to keep pace with the current changing roles of the teacher in this technology driven educational scenario. The institution has full-fledged computer laboratory with LAN and 24 hours uninterrupted Internet connection. The laboratory is equipped with Scanner, CD writer and other equipments which are effectively utilized by the faculty as well as students to make their teaching learning process and research effective. Open access to online research based journals is provided to the students to equip them with the skills of conducting research.

Psychology Laboratory

The institution optimally utilizes the Psychology Laboratory which has various standardized intelligence tests, aptitude, creativity tests and also interest, adjustment and personality inventories which prove to be beneficial to the M Ed and the PhD students in their endeavors related to psychological constructs. In addition to this, the institute is equipped with the requisite equipments required for conducting the various psychology experiments for B Ed students

Physical Science Laboratory

This lab was created in 2009. It has arrangements for performing science experiments. There are cupboards for storing various models, equipments and teaching aids. This room has provision for displaying all the teaching resources of the institute. Students utilize these resources and also generate new resources during various club activities. Every year the teaching resources made by students are added to this lab.

Women's Empowerment Cell

The College has constituted Women's Empowerment Cell in 2009. The Women's Empowerment Cell (WEC) is a statutory body for the prevention/action against sexual harassment of women. It looks into the grievances/complaints of teaching, non-teaching staff and teacher-trainees, especially in cases of gender discrimination.

Objectives of the Cell

- ★ To create awareness of sexual harassment through guest lectures
- ★ To ensure protection of girls/women from sexual harassment studying/working in the premises
- ★ To redress the cases of sexual harassment if any
- ★ To enforce disciplinary framework for students
- ★ To organize workshops, seminars and talks to convey the message of Gender Equality (Gender Sensitization Workshops)
- ★ To organize the gender awareness through posters/slogans/essay competition/ screening of films/street plays
- ★ To organize the programs with other associations of the college such as Students council, Cultural Association, etc.

Rules & Regulations

- ★ Every Student shall be cleanly and decently dressed.
- * Every student shall solute the members of the staff on the occasion of his first meeting them on the college premises.
- * No student shall leave the class room either with or without permission, or until the teacher has left the class room.
- * No student who comes to his class after the roll call is taken shall enter the class room without the permission of the teacher in charge of the class.
- ★ Every student shall sit in the place assigned to him in the class room.
- ★ Students who have leisure on any working day shall remain in the reading room.
- * Loitering on the verandah, disfiguring or destroying furniture and writing on walls are strictly prohibited. Students violating this rule will be fined heavily.
- * Students attending lectures in the class rooms or working in the laboratories or attending debates on the college premises shall maintain perfect silence.
- ★ Students getting in or getting out of a class room or moving from one class room to another shall do so in an orderly manner without making any noise.
- * Students are prohibited from defacing or damaging the building or furniture in any way. The cost of any damage or loss so caused will be recovered from the students collectively if the responsibility for it can not be fixed on any individual or individuals.
- ★ Students are expected to read notices posted on the college notice board and ignorance of any notice thus posted will not be accepted as an excuse for failure to complywith it.

- * No meeting or debate of any kind shall be conducted by students on the college premises without the written permission of the principal.
- ★ Students are advised not to align themselves with any political party or take part in any political agitation.
- * Students are not allowed to make a complaint in a body or address any authorities in a collective petition. Such combined action is subversive of good order.
- * No subscription of any kind shall be collected by any student without the written permission of the Principal.
- ★ No Student shall organize or join a strike of any kind.
- * Any student who contravenes this rule will be expelled from the college.
- * Any act of misbehavior or indiscipline will entail suspension or expulsion from the college.
- * Students who are not living with their parents or legal guardians shall reside in the hostel or in lodgings approved by the Principal.
- * In regard to all matters not specified in the forgoing rule, students shall aim at conducting themselves with the highest standard of conduct befitting the reputation of the Institution.
- ★ The Principal's decision shall be final in matters of punishment to the students for violation of any of the college rules.
- ★ Transfer certificate and conduct certificate will not be issued until all the dues to the college and hostel or paid.

Department of Attendance

- * Rules and Regulations for students regarding granting of Leave of absence from class.
- * No Student shall absent himself from the class without leave. All leave applications in the prescribed form

- should be endorsed by the Parent / Guardian / Warden.
- * Students residing in private building (unauthorized hostels or in rooms without guardian) must get their leave application forms countersigned by the respective Heads of Depts. in the place of parents / Guardians / Wardens.
- * All leave applications duly filled must be handed over to the Prof-in-charge of Attendance in person or any person authorized by him or be sent by Post so as to reach the Prof in-charge of Attendance a day before leave begins.
- * Leave applied for in time will ordinarily be granted when proper reasons are given. But in case of leave extending to three days or more for reasons of illness and other unavoidable circumstances, the Prof incharge of Attendance may require the production of medical or other certificates.
- * A student who continuously absents himself for 15 days without valid reasons will his name struck from off the rolls and recommendation will be considered only on the recommendation from the respective Heads of the Departments.
- ★ The Applicants who plead sickness for more than five days will not be granted leave unless their application is supported by a medical certificate given by a Registered Medical Practitioner.
- ★ All cases of French leave will be reported to the Parent / Guardian and the postal expenses will be recovered from absentees.
- * A student absenting himself without leave during one hour of the day will be considered absent for half-a-day.
- ★ A student requiring leave for a portion of a period must apply to the teacher in person before the classes

- begin. Other application shall be addressed to the Prof-in-charge of Attendance.
- ★ Absence from the Examination and Tests on medical grounds must be supported by a certificate from respective Heads of the Depts. and a certificate from a registered medical practitioner.
- ★ Absentees from classes without leave for the whole day will pay a fine of Rupee 1/-
- ★ Absentees for one hour even if it is first hour in a session will be considered absent for that session and 50 paise will be the fine for such absence.
- ★ A list of absentees in a working day will be put up on the notice board on the third day of the next working week. Any discrepancy found there in must be reported to the Prof-in-charge of attendance within 48 hours, otherwise the fine will stand.
- * A student who finds himself wrongly in the list of absentees or in the fine lists shall meet the Prof-incharge of attendance for rectification of the discrepancies.
- * Truants from classes and long absentees shall be dealt with severely. The punishment may involve suspension or removal from the College or withholding his scholarship and appearance for University Examination.
- ★ Fine should be paid in the College office within 10 days from the date of notification of the fine imposed by the Attendance Department. After this period, defaulters roll number will be struck off. A fine will be collected from defaulters at the rate of Rs.1 per day for not more than five days.
- ★ Those who want to have a personal talk with the Prof-in-charge of Attendance in connection with the grant of leave or cancellation of fine should meet him between 2.00 p.m. and 3.00 p.m. on all working days except Thursday.

Guidance & Counselling Cell

The motto of Guidance & Counselling Cell(GCC) which functions as a part of Student Support Services(SSS) for student retention. The principal and all the tutors do the counselling of the Teacher-trainees and guide them regarding curricular, co- curricular, career and personal matters. The Cell nurtures the students through the different activities and allows the students to cross the hurdles in the academic year thereby marching smoothly towards success. The Guidance and Counseling Committee is looked after by a teaching faculty. Under this cell there are different programs conducted with an aim of catering to the needs of individual differences.

The following are the activities conducted under this cell

- ★ Remedial coaching
- **★** Mentoring through study circles
- ★ Assistance through proctorial system
- ★ Linkage with bank for educational loan
- **★** Scholarship for eligible Teacher -Trainees
- ★ Career oriented training programmes

Proctorial System

The proctorial system has been introduced for effective improvement of student teacher relation in the institution. The students of a proctorial group are assigned to a member of the teaching staff who shall act as their Proctor. The students are required to meet the proctor daily to report the progress of their studies and other academic difficulties. The students of the proctorial groups shall meet the proctors at the lunch break and discuss with her their difficulties and academic problems. The students shall furnish such information to the proctors as required for the maintenance of the proctorial record. No student shall leave the campus without informing the proctor. No student can ordinarily meet the principal on official business without the permission for

the Proctor nor can any application be submitted without the recommendation of the proctor. Any adverse report against a student by the Proctor will be seriously viewed and dealt with accordingly with the intimation to their parents. Monthly fees and other fees of a student will only be accepted after submission of the monthly proctorial records by the proctor. No help from any source or other forms of assistance will be given to a student unless recommended by the proctor. The promotion in the college Examination and an issue of the final conduct and transfer certificate-from the college will also be reflected on the Proctorial records of a student during the period of study in the College. Each student will be the ward of a teaching staff who will be his/her Proctor.
