
Inclusion of Girl Children in Education- Concept

Inclusion of Girl Children in Education-Concept


The University Education Commission 1948-49

• The Article 15(1) provides that the state shall not discriminate any citizen on ground only of sex.



Inclusion of Girl Children in Education

• Under Article 15(3) the state can make special provision for education of women and children.



Inclusion of Girl Children in Education-Concept

• It is only through the education of women, that we can expect better atmosphere at homes, better hygiene conditions, greater production, greater reduction in fertility rate and happier family life.



Inclusion of girl children means-

- Minimising the sex Stero-typing in education.
- A challenge to address gender discrimination in education.
- Providing measures to address economic, academic, social dimensions that lead to exclusion.
- Accessing educational opportunity equally.
- Meeting the goals of constitutional objectives framed for education of girls.

- Provisions of transport.
- Special escorts for girl children.
- Counselling programme that negotiate domestic work burdens of the girls.
- Gender training programmes for the teachers for making classroom practices more gender sensitive.



 Provision of gender sensitive curriculum, classroom pedagogy and life skills in the educational programmes..

Setting up of residential schools for girls with all

types of facilities.



- Recruitment of more number of women teachers in the schools.
- Provision of security to deal with the forms of gender bias in the schools.



- Encouragement of the participation of the parents specially the mother.
- Forming of forums of female teachers.

 Provision of management system which report on practices of gender based discrimination.



- Appointment of women in school monitoring committees.
- Setting up of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidhyalaya where female literacy is below national average.
